Kemoy Walker - recognised by the Prime Minister for establishing projects that bring together and inspire young people in the local community.

After seeing the devastating effect that gang violence have in the local area, he was inspired to bring about positive change in the community.

For the 15 years, he has done Youth Work in the community, running a popular youth club for young people, setting up activities to keep young people off the streets.



Kemoy also founded a Performing arts group called KYSO, which is made up of around 89 young people from Moss Side. The group provides a purpose and an inspiration to troubled young people, and my role provides pastoral support, advice, and lessons in entrepreneurship. He is a Moss Side Ambassador, and was also the driving force behind the foundation of the Manchester Youth Council, prompting young people to engage in their community.

Kemoy has shown himself to be a real community champion, supporting and empowering Moss Side young people to get the skills and opportunities they need to shape their own lives and make the changes they want to see in their city. He has achieved many things such as meeting Her Majesty The Queen in 2012; Received a letter from the Prime Minister in 2016 (www.kemoywalker.co.uk).

Kemoy is now a Head of Year in a large Catholic school in Manchester where he is responsible for Year 9, which consists of 276 students.



Louise Da-Cocodia - tending to the sick and fighting for the needy.

The invitation to Commonwealth citizens to help rebuild the country, battered after the war, was the defining event in the story of Manchester's modern-day black community. Veterans, professionals and students, seamen, factory workers - and many nurses - made the city their home in the 20th century.

Louise Da-Cocodia MBE, who arrived in Britain from Jamaica as a 21-year-old in 1955, overcame the overt racism of the time to become the first black senior nursing officer in Manchester, before becoming a dedicated anti-racism campaigner.

She was massively committed to the wider community as well as campaigning for equality in education, health and housing for black people, serving as a JP and Deputy Lord Lieutenant of Manchester. A lifetime of high-level civic service ended when she died, aged 73, in 2008. (Credit to MEN)
